But the Ottoman Empire is collapsing, and even this peaceful place, where Greeks and Turks, Christians and Muslims, have lived and worked together for centuries, will succumb to the wrenching spasms of religion and nationalism born in the wake of the Great War and the rise of Kemal Atatürk. As he did in Captain Corelli's Mandolin, Louis de Bernières traces the seismic shifts of nations through the lives and relationships of those caught in their tumult. 625.
